Where: Mr. Blair's Room

What: Prepare one of the two parts from the attached script. Find a partner to do the other part with you. If you do not want to find a partner one will be randomly assigned on the day of the audition.

Singing Auditions (optional, highly recommended)

When: Friday, January 19, during regular music class time.

Where: Mr. Bartunek's Room

What: Prepare the first verse of *Mystery Dinner Show 3000*. Audio recordings can be found on Mr. Bartunek's website. Singing auditions will be done individually and will take place in front of your peers.

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Important Information

1. ALL lines **MUST** be memorized by April 4, 2024. Students who do not have their lines memorized by that day may be replaced.

2. Students **must** be in attendance for large-group rehearsals April 1 through April 26. Unless it is an extreme emergency, students who are absent may be replaced. Please e-mail Mr. Bartunek if you are going to be out of town (jbartunek@northbrook28.net).

Large-group rehearsals take place every **THURSDAY** and **FRIDAY**, April 1 - April 19, from 1:30-3:30. On April 23, 24, 25, and 26 rehearsals will take place from 2:00-3:30.

3. Students are expected to be on their best behavior during the rehearsal process. Any student who repeatedly disrupts rehearsal will receive a call home and be put on probation. After a second call home the student may be replaced.

4. Workshop rehearsals will take place during lunch/recess starting in February. This schedule will be distributed after the musical has been cast.

5. Exceptions to these rules will be handled on a case-by-case basis, and will be allowed for emergencies.

6. Everything takes place during the school day except for the evening performances.

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FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. ***When is the musical?*** Green Cast performs on Thursday, April 25 at 7:00 PM.
Gray Cast performs on Friday, April 26 at 7:00 PM.
2. ***Does every child get a part?*** Every child will get at least one part in the musical.
3. ***Will I need to provide a costume?*** Possibly. There are a lot of costumes already owned by Greenbriar. If your child needs a special outfit that we cannot supply, Mr. Bartunek or Mr. Blair will contact you in March.
4. ***Will my child have a solo?*** Possibly. Auditions for solos will be done during music class during the week of January 15.
5. ***Does every child have to audition?*** For a speaking part, yes. Students will be auditioning as a class during the week of January 15. The audition will take place during lunch/recess. Singing auditions are optional but highly recommended.
6. ***Will my child miss lunch or recess with their classmates?*** At times, yes. Most rehearsals take place during lunch and recess. If your child has a small role then they will not miss many lunch or recess periods. If your child has a large role they will miss more recess time.
7. ***Will my child still be able to eat lunch?*** Yes! Lunch/Recess rehearsals will not begin until students have eaten lunch (usually lunch is eaten in the music room).
8. ***What is the rehearsal schedule?*** The rehearsal schedule is made on a weekly basis and will be given to all teachers and posted on Mr. Bartunek's webpage by Friday, the week before the rehearsal.
9. ***We're going to be out of town, who should I notify?*** Please let Mr. Bartunek know ASAP if your child will be missing any school. The rehearsal schedule will be adjusted to accommodate for absences if enough notice is given.
10. ***If my child misses a rehearsal will they be replaced?*** Maybe. If multiple rehearsals are missed because of forgetfulness or no advance warning, Mr. Bartunek will discuss other options with the parent and child. If rehearsals are missed during the month of April due to family vacations, sporting events, scheduled appointments, or any other reason besides legitimate illness or family emergencies, your child will probably be replaced.
11. ***My child is sick on a day they have rehearsal, should they still come to school?*** NO! Please stay home and get better, just let Mr. Bartunek know via e-mail or phone call.
12. ***Are there any after school practices?*** No. Everything takes place during the school day except for the final evening performances.
